

## **Local Mayors Hold Multi-Municipality Voter Registration Drive**

September 28, 2017 – Five municipalities in Middlesex County have coordinated efforts to hold non-partisan voter registration drives in their communities. The event will be held on Monday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 6:00-8:00pm in each municipality. Participating mayors include: Mayor Gayle Brill Mittler of Highland Park, Mayor John Krenzel of South River, Mayor Brad Cohen of East Brunswick, Mayor Brian Wahler of Piscataway, and Mayor Peter Cammarano of Metuchen. Locations in each municipality are listed below.

The cooperative effort, coordinated by Highland Park Mayor Gayle Brill Mittler, will be a non-partisan instruction session during which residents can fill in the application to register to vote, and mail it in to the Middlesex County Commission of Registration. Volunteers will be on hand to answer questions about the registration forms. The event is free for the public.

“It is our civic responsibility to vote. Our goal as mayors, no matter what our party affiliation, is to encourage our citizens to perform their right and duty of voting in our free society,” said Mayor Gayle Brill Mittler. “Middlesex County is lucky to have so many mayors committed to ensuring our democracy runs on the will of the people.

Voting Registration Drive locations in each municipality are as follows:

- Highland Park – Senior/Youth Center, 220 South 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Highland Park
- Metuchen – Public Library, 480 Middlesex Avenue, Metuchen
- Piscataway – Borough Hall Clerk’s Office, 455 Hoes Lane, Piscataway
- South River – Borough Hall, 48 Washington Street, South River
