The Family Health Line is staffed by trained telephone counselors who give information and referrals for health screening and treatment. The call is toll-free and the service is available 24 hours a day from anywhere in the state. Counselors speak English and Spanish, and can also connect to an interpreter service for other languages.

The N.J. Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) offers supplemental nutritious foods to pregnant, breastfeeding and postpartum women, infants and children up to the age of five. The program serves families who have no income or a low income. WIC also assists families experiencing short-term financial hardships like unemployment.
