ORDINANCES – SECOND READING AND PUBLIC HEARING

ORD 2010-17

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 350 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER ENTITLED “ZONING” BY AMENDING SECTION 350-25 “PLATS, PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES” THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 350 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled “Zoning” be amended by amending Section 350-25 entitled “Plats, Permits and Certificates” as follows:

SECTION 1.

350-25. Plats, permits and certificates

No construction of any building, dwelling or structure shall be commenced before an application for a building permit under this chapter shall be made to the Construction Official. The application shall be accompanied by a

plat or plan of the site, in duplicate, drawn to scale and signed and sealed by a New Jersey licensed land surveyor or professional engineer, showing the following: the dimensions of the lot to be built upon, the location of and accurate dimension of the proposed building and all existing structures of the site, the intended use of the proposed building and all existing structures, the number of stories in the building, the number of families the building is designed to accommodate, dimensions of yards, the established building lines within the block, proposed improvements to the lot, such as sidewalks and curbs, existing road and lot elevation, proposed site grading and finished floor elevation of the lowest floor, the proposed location of water and sewer services proposed location of silt fencing, proposed earth stabilization measures and drainage improvements and such other information as may be required by the office of the Construction Official to provide for the enforcement of this chapter.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

Additions are underlined, deletions are in brackets.

BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING IN PART BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2003-18 ADOPTED ON JULY 21, 2003, AS AMENDED BY BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2008-26 ADOPTED ON JULY 14, 2008, AS AMENDED BY BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2008-48 ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 23, 2008, PROVIDING FOR PRELIMINARY EXPENSES AND CONSTRUCTION EXPENSES IN CONNECTION WITH THE RESURFACING AND UPGRADING OF THE APPLEBY AVENUE WATER STORAGE TOWER AND FOR THE PUBLIC WORKS GROUND WATER STORAGE TANK FOR THE WATER UTILITY OF THE BOROUGH, IN ORDER TO INCREASE THE APPROPRIATION THEREFOR BY \$420,000 FOR A TOTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$1,870,000, TO INCREASE THE AUTHORIZED BONDS AND NOTES TO BE ISSUED TO FINANCE A PORTION OF THE COSTS THEREOF BY \$399,000 FOR A TOTAL DEBT AUTHORIZATION OF \$1,781,500, AND TO INCREASE THE ALLOCATION OF THE APPROPRIATION TO COSTS PERMITTED UNDER N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough of South River, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Borough") finally adopted Bond Ordinance No. 2003-13 on July 21, 2003, as amended by Bond Ordinance No. 2008-27 adopted on July 14, 2008, as amended by Bond Ordinance No. 2008-48 adopted on December 23, 2008 (collectively the "Prior Ordinance"), providing for the preliminary and construction expenses in connection with the resurfacing and upgrading of the Appleby Avenue Water Storage Tower and for the Public Works Ground Storage Tank for the Water Utility of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the costs associated with said improvements are higher than anticipated and has determined to supplement the appropriation and bonds and notes authorized therefore, and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the \$250,000 authorized by the Prior Ordinance for purposes permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is insufficient and desires to increase such allocation by \$10,000 to an aggregate amount of \$260,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring),
AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized as general improvements to be undertaken in and by the Borough of South River, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Borough") and were previously authorized by the Borough by the Prior Ordinance. For the improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby

appropriated the sum of \$420,000 in addition to the \$1,450,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinance, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and including the sum of \$88,500 as down payment, \$67,500 of such down payment was previously appropriated by the Prior Ordinances, and an additional down payment of \$21,000 is authorized hereby and is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in the Capital Improvement Fund of one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the costs of said improvements or purposes, \$399,000 negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in addition to the \$1,382,500 previously authorized by the Prior Ordinance for a total principal amount not to exceed \$1,781,500 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The improvements hereby authorized and the purpose for which the obligations are to be issued is for the preliminary expenses and construction expenses in connection with the evaluation, resurfacing and upgrading of the Appleby Avenue Water Storage Tower and the Public Works Ground Water Storage Tank for the Water Utility of the Borough, together with all items necessary, incidental or appurtenant thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with plans, specifications or requisitions therefore on file with or through the Borough Clerk, as finally approved by the governing body of the Borough

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$1,781,500, including the \$399,000 authorized herein, as stated in Section 2 hereof.

(c) The estimated cost of the improvements or purposes described in Section 3(a) hereof is \$1,870,000, which is equal to the amount of the \$420,000 supplemental appropriation herein made therefor and the \$1,450,000 appropriation made by the Prior Ordinance.

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer of the Borough, provided that no note shall mature later than one (1) year from its date. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-8. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer, who shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes

shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of such notes occurs, such report shall include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense and are improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as a general improvement of the Water Utility and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of the improvements or purposes, within the limitations of the Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the amount of the obligations authorized for said purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is ten (10) years.

(c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such Statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$399,000 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$260,000, including \$10,000 authorized hereby and \$250,000 authorized by the Prior Ordinance, for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

(e) To the extent that moneys of the Borough are used to finance, on an interim basis, costs of said improvements or purposes, the Borough reasonably expects such costs to be

paid or reimbursed with the proceeds of obligations issued pursuant hereto. This ordinance shall constitute a declaration of official intent for the purposes and within the meaning of Section 1.150-2(e) of the United States Treasury Regulations.

(f) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Borough solely for purposes described in subparagraph (h) of §40A:2-7 of the Local Bond Law, and the obligations authorized herein are to be issued for purposes which are self-liquidating within the meaning and limitation of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-45 of said Law and are deductible from the gross debt of the Borough pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:2-44c and N.J.S.A. 40A:2-46 of said Law.

Section 6. The capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. The resolution in the form promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services is on file with the Municipal Clerk and is available there for public inspection.

Section 7. Any grant or similar moneys from time to time received by the Borough for the improvements or purposes described in Section 3 hereof, shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are received and so used.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and, unless paid from other sources, the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 9. All Ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or are inconsistent. In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part hereof other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 10. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Council President Krenzel opened the hearing to the public for comments/questions.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 22 OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER ENTITLED "BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND AUTHORITIES" BY AMENDING SECTION 22-22 OF ARTICLE V "MUNICIPAL CULTURAL ARTS AND HERITAGE COMMISSION" THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 22 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled "Boards, Commissions and Authorities" be amended by amending Section 22-22 of Article V "Municipal Cultural Arts and Heritage Commission" as follows.

SECTION 1.

22-22. Election of Officers; meetings; by-laws.

A. One of the members shall be elected by the members of the Commission as Chairman; the Commission shall also elect a Vice Chairman and Secretary.

B. The Commission shall conduct ten monthly meetings annually at a date and time to be determined, for which minutes shall be recorded by the Secretary as set forth in the by-laws of said Commission.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause of provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

ORD 2010-21

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, CHAPTER 263 ENTITLED "ROLL-OFF DUMPSTERS" BY AMENDING THE TITLE TO "ROLL-OFF DUMPSTERS AND REFUSE CONTAINERS/DUMPSTERS" AND ADDING A NEW ARTICLE II ENTITLED "REFUSE CONTAINERS/ DUMPSTERS" THEREOF

WHEREAS, the governing body desires to require that all dumpsters and other refuse containers that are outdoors or exposed to stormwater to be covered at all times and prohibits the spilling, dumping, leaking, or otherwise discharge of liquids, semi-liquids or solids from the containers to the municipal separate storm sewer system(s) operated by the Borough of South River and/or the waters of the State so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 263 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled "Roll-Off Dumpsters" be amended by amending the title to "Roll-Off Dumpsters and Refuse Containers/dumpsters" and adding a new Article II entitled "Refuse Containers/Dumpsters", as follows:

SECTION 1.

Chapter 263
Roll-Off Dumpsters and Refuse Containers/Dumpsters
Article II
Refuse Containers/Dumpsters

263-7. Definitions.

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

- a. Municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4) – a conveyance or system of conveyances (including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, manmade channels, or storm drains) that is owned or operated by Borough of South River or other public body, and is designed and used for collecting and conveying stormwater.
- b. Person – any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.
- c. Refuse container – any waste container that a person controls whether owned, leased, or operated, including dumpsters, trash cans, garbage pails, and plastic trash bags.
- d. Stormwater – means water resulting from precipitation (including rain and snow) that runs off the land's surface, is transmitted to the subsurface, is captured by separate storm sewers or other sewerage or drainage facilities, or is conveyed by snow removal equipment.
- e. Waters of the State – means the ocean and its estuaries, all springs, streams and bodies of surface or ground water, whether natural or artificial, within the boundaries of the State of New Jersey or subject to its jurisdiction.

263-8. Prohibited Conduct.

Any person who controls, whether owned, leased, or operated, a refuse container or dumpster must ensure that such container or dumpster is covered at all times and shall prevent refuse from spilling out or overflowing.

Any person who owns, leases or otherwise uses a refuse container or dumpster must ensure that such container or dumpster does not leak or otherwise discharge liquids, semi-liquids or solids to the municipal separate storm sewer system(s) operated by the Borough of South River.

263-9. Exceptions to Prohibition.

- a. Permitted temporary demolition containers

- b. Litter receptacles (other than dumpsters or other bulk containers)
- c. Individual homeowner trash and recycling containers
- d. Refuse containers at facilities authorized to discharge stormwater under a valid NJPDES permit
- e. Large bulky items (e.g., furniture, bound carpet and padding, white goods placed curbside for pickup)

263-10. Enforcement.

This Article shall be enforced by the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough of South River.

263-11. Penalties.

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$2,000, imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a period of community service not exceeding 90 days.

263-12. Effective date.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause of provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

ORD 2010-22

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER,
CHAPTER 333 ENTITLED "WATER" BY AMENDING SECTION 333-31 THEREOF

WHEREAS, the governing body desires to require the retrofitting of existing storm drain inlets which are in direct contact with repaving, repairing, reconstruction, or resurfacing or alterations of facilities on private property, to prevent the discharge of solids and floatables (such as plastic bottles, cans, food wrappers and other litter) to the municipal separate storm sewer system(s) operated by the Borough of South River so as to protect public health, safety and welfare, and to prescribe penalties for the failure to comply.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 333 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled "Water" by amending Section 333-31 as follows:

SECTION 1.

333-31. Stormwater connections prohibited; private stormwater drain inlet retrofitting

A) **Definitions:**

For the purpose of this ordinance, the following terms, phrases, words, and their derivations shall have the meanings stated herein unless their use in the text of this Chapter clearly demonstrates a different meaning. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words used in the plural number include the singular number, and words used in the singular number include the plural number. The word "shall" is always mandatory and not merely directory.

a. Municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4)– a conveyance or system of conveyances (including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, curbs, gutters, ditches, manmade channels, or storm drains) that is owned or operated by Borough of South River or other public body, and is designed and used for collecting and conveying stormwater.

b. Person – any individual, corporation, company, partnership, firm, association, or political subdivision of this State subject to municipal jurisdiction.

c. Storm drain inlet- an opening in a storm 'drain used to collect stormwater runoff and includes, but, is not limited to a grate inlet, curb-opening inlet, slotted inlet, and combination inlet

d. Waters of the State means the ocean and its estuaries, all springs, streams and bodies of surface or ground water, whether natural or artificial, within the boundaries of the State of New Jersey or subject to its jurisdiction.

B. Prohibited Connections;

No stormwater connections to the Borough sewer system will be allowed to any [the] licensee, [to the] who may be subject to forfeiture of his license [as well as the pains] and penalties [of] under his bond.

C. Prohibited Conduct:

No person in control of private property (except a residential lot with one single family house) shall authorize the repaving, repairing (excluding the repair of individual potholes), resurfacing (including top coating or chip sealing with asphalt emulsion or a thin base of hot bitumen), reconstructing or altering any surface that is in direct contact with an existing storm drain inlet on that property unless the storm drain inlet either:

1. Already meets the design standard below to control passage of solid and floatable materials;
or
2. Is retrofitted or replaced to meet the standard in Section V below prior to the completion of the project.

D. Design Standard:

Storm drain inlets identified in Section IV above shall comply with the following standard to control passage of solid and floatable, materials through storm drain inlets. For purposes of this paragraph, "solid and floatable materials" means sediment, - debris, trash, and other floating, suspended, or settleable solids. For exemptions to this standard see Section V.3 below.

1. Design engineers shall use either of the following grates whenever they use a grate in pavement or another ground surface to collect stormwater from that surface into a storm drain or surface water body under that grate:
 - a. The New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) bicycle safe grate, which is described in Chapter 2.4 of the NJDOT Bicycle Compatible Roadways and Bikeways Planning and Design Guidelines (April 1996); or

b. A different grate, if each individual clear space in that grate has an area of no more than seven (7.0) square inches, or is no greater than 0.5 inches across the smallest dimension.

Examples of grates subject to this standard include grates in grate inlets, the grate portion (non-curb-opening portion) of combination inlets, grates on storm sewer manholes, ditch grates, trench grates, and grates of spacer bars in slotted drains. Examples of ground surfaces include surfaces of roads (including bridges), driveways, parking areas, bikeways, plazas, sidewalks, lawns, fields, open channels, and stormwater basin floors.

2. Whenever design engineers use a curb-opening inlet, the clear space in that curb opening (or each individual clear space, if the curb opening has two or more clear spaces) shall have an area of no more than seven (7.0) square inches, or be no greater than two (2.0) inches across the smallest dimension.

3. This standard does not apply:

a. Where the municipal engineer agrees that this standard would cause inadequate hydraulic performance that could not practicably be overcome by using additional or larger storm drain inlets that meet these standards;

b. Where flows are conveyed through any device (e.g., end of pipe netting facility, manufactured treatment device, or a catch basin hood) that is designed, at a minimum, to prevent delivery of all solid and floatable materials that could not pass through one of the following:

i. A rectangular space four and five-eighths inches long and one and one-half inches wide (this option does not apply for outfall netting facilities); or

ii. A bar screen having a bar spacing of 0.5 inches.

c. Where flows are conveyed through a trash rack that has parallel bars with one-inch (1") spacing between the bars; or

d. Where the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection determines, pursuant to the New Jersey Register of Historic Places Rules at N.J.A.C. 7:4-7.2(c), that action to meet this standard is an undertaking that constitutes an encroachment or will damage or destroy the New Jersey Register listed historic property.

E. Enforcement:

This ordinance shall be enforced by the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough of South River.

F. Penalties:

Any person(s) who is found to be in violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not to exceed \$2,000, imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a period of community service not exceeding 90 days for each storm drain inlet that is not retrofitted to meet the design standard.

G. Effective date:

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and any publication as may be required by law.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause of provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

SECTION 1.

169-9C. Waivers.

(6) The Borough of South River and functions sponsored by any Borough appointed committee or advisory board.

169-12. Automatic fire alarms and carbon monoxide alarms for residential use.

(A) A structure used or intended for use for residential purposes classified as a Use Group R-3 or R-4 dwelling shall comply with the requirements set forth by N.J.A.C. 5:70-2.3 and N.J.S.A. 52:27D-198.1.

(B) Before any Use Group R-3 or R-4 structure is sold, leased or otherwise made subject to a change of occupancy for residential purposes, the owner shall obtain certificates of smoke detector, carbon monoxide alarm and fire extinguisher compliance (CSDCMAC), evidencing compliance with N.J.A.C. 5:70-4.19, from the appropriate enforcing agency.

169-14. Key box.

(A) Installation. When a property is protected by automatic alarm system and access to or within a structure or an area on that property is unduly difficult because of secured openings, and where immediate access is necessary for lifesaving or fire-fighting purposes, the Fire Official may require a key box to be installed in an approved location. The key box shall be of a type approved by the Fire Official and may be required to have tamper proof devices included.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause of provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.
