ORDINANCES-SECOND READING & PUBLIC HEARING

ORD 2011-18

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER,  
CHAPTER 350 ENTITLED "ZONING" BY ADDING A NEW SECTION 350-19.1  
ENTITLED "RIPARIAN ZONE DISTRICT" THERETO

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 350 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled “Zoning” be amended by adding a new section 350-19.1 entitled Riparian Zone District” as follows:

**SECTION 1. 350.19.1. Riparian Zone District**

**A. Purpose and Authority.**

The purpose of this Ordinance is to designate riparian zones, and to provide for land use regulation therein in order to protect the streams, lakes, and other surface water bodies of the Borough of South River and to comply with N.J.A.C. 7:15-5.25(g)3, which requires municipalities to adopt an ordinance that prevents new disturbance for projects or activities in riparian zones as described herein. Compliance with the riparian zone requirements of this Ordinance does not constitute compliance with the riparian zone or buffer requirements imposed under any other Federal, State or local statute, regulation or ordinance.

**B. Definitions.**

The definitions of the words and/or terms utilized in this Article shall be as defined or described in the Water Quality Management Planning rules, N.J.A.C. 7:15, the Stormwater Management Rules, N.J.A. C. 7:8, and/or Flood Hazard Area Control Act Rules, N.J.A. C. 7:13, as they exist as of the effective date of this Ordinance and as they may be amended over time.

**C. Establishment and Protection of Riparian Zones.**

1. Except as provided in Sections D. and E. below, riparian zones adjacent to all surface water bodies shall be protected from avoidable disturbance and shall be delineated as follows:

a. The riparian zone shall be 300 feet wide along both sides of any Category One water (CI water), and all upstream tributaries situated within the same HUC 14 watershed.

b. The riparian zone shall be 150 feet wide along both sides of the following waters not designated as CI waters:

i) Any trout production water and all upstream waters (including tributaries);

ii) Any trout maintenance water and all upstream waters (including tributaries) within one linear mile as measured along the length of the regulated water;

iii) Any segment of a water flowing through an area that contains documented habitat for a threatened or endangered species of plant or animal, which is critically dependent on the surface water body for survival, and all upstream waters (including tributaries) within one linear mile as measured along the length of the regulated water; and

iv) Any segment of a water flowing through an area that contains acid producing soils.

c. For all other surface water bodies, a riparian zone of 50 feet wide shall be maintained along both sides of the water.

2. If a discernible bank is not present along a surface water body, the portion of the riparian zone outside the surface water body is measured landward as follows:

a. Along a linear fluvial or tidal water, such as a stream, the riparian zone is measured landward of the feature's centerline;

b. Along a non-linear fluvial water, such as a lake or pond, the riparian zone is measured landward of the normal water surface limit;

c. Along a non-linear tidal water, such as a bay or inlet, the riparian zone is measured landward of the mean high water line; and

d. Along an amorphously-shaped feature such as a wetland complex, through which water flows but which lacks a discernible channel, the riparian zone is measured landward of the feature's centerline.

3. The applicant or designated representative shall be responsible for the initial determination of the presence of a riparian zone on a site, and for identifying the area of the riparian zone on any plan submitted to the Borough of South River in conjunction with an application for a construction permit, subdivision, land development, or other improvement that requires plan submissions or permits. This initial determination shall be subject to review and approval by the municipal engineer, governing body, or its appointed representative, and, where required by State regulation, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection.

#### **D. Variances.**

To the extent allowed by the Stormwater Management Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:8), the Flood Hazard Area Control Act Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:13), and the Highlands Water Protection and Planning Act Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:38), new disturbances for projects or activities in the riparian zone established by this Ordinance may be allowed through the Zoning Board of Adjustment review and approval of a variance, provided the disturbance is proposed to be located on a pre-existing lot (existing as of the effective date of this ordinance) when there is insufficient room outside the riparian zone for the proposed use otherwise permitted by the underlying zoning; there is no other reasonable or prudent alternative to placement in the riparian zone, including obtaining variances from setback or other requirements that would allow conformance with the riparian zone requirements; and upon proof by virtue of submission of appropriate maps, drawings, reports and testimony, that the disturbance is:

1. Necessary to protect public health, safety or welfare;
2. To provide an environmental benefit;
3. To prevent extraordinary hardship on the property owner peculiar to the property; or
4. To prevent extraordinary hardship, provided the hardship was not created by the property owner, by not allowing a minimum economically viable use of the property based upon reasonable investment.

#### **E. Exceptions**

To the extent allowed under the Stormwater Management Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:8), the Flood Hazard Area Control Act Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:13), and the Highlands Water Protection and Planning Act Rules (N.J.A.C. 7:38) and subject to review and approval by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to the extent required by those rules, the following disturbances for projects or activities in the riparian zone established by this Ordinance are allowed:

1. Redevelopment within the limits of existing impervious surfaces;
2. Linear development with no feasible alternative route;

3. Disturbance that is in accordance with a stream corridor restoration or stream bank stabilization plan or project approved by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection;

4. Disturbance necessary to provide for public pedestrian access or water dependent recreation that meets the requirements of the Freshwater Wetlands Protection Act rules, N.J.A.C. 7:7A, the Flood Hazard Area Control Act rules, N.J.A.C. 7:13, or the Coastal Zone Management rules, N.J.A.C. 7:7E; or

5. Disturbance with no feasible alternative required for the remediation of hazardous substances performed with New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection or Federal oversight pursuant to the Spill Compensation and Control Act, N.J.S.A. 58:10-23.1 la et seq. or the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, and Liability Act of 1980, 42 U.S.C. §§9601 et seq.

#### **F. Appeals**

1. Any party aggrieved by the location of the riparian zone boundary determination under this Ordinance may appeal to the Zoning Officer under the provisions of this Ordinance. The party contesting the location of the riparian zone boundary shall have the burden of proof in case of any such appeal.

2. Any party aggrieved by any determination or decision of the Zoning Officer under this Ordinance may appeal to the Zoning Board of Adjustment of the Borough. The party contesting the determination or decision shall have the burden of proof in case of any such appeal.

#### **G. Enforcement**

A prompt investigation shall be made by the Code Enforcement Officer of the Borough of South River, pursuant to Section 350-28 hereinafter, of any person or entity believed to be in violation hereof. If, upon inspection, a condition which is in violation of this Ordinance is discovered, a civil action in the Special Part of the Superior Court, or in the Superior Court, if the primary relief sought is injunctive or if penalties may exceed the jurisdictional limit of the Special Civil Part, may be instituted by the filing and serving of appropriate process. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to preclude the right of the Borough of South River, pursuant to N.J.S.A 26:3A2-25, to initiate legal proceedings hereunder in Municipal Court. The violation of any section or subsection of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate and distinct offense independent of the violation of any other section or subsection, or of any order issued pursuant to this Ordinance. Each day a violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

#### **SECTION 2.**

All other ordinances, parts of ordinances, or other local requirements that are inconsistent or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby superseded to the extent of any inconsistency or conflict, and the provisions of this Ordinance shall apply.

#### **SECTION 3.**

a. Interpretation: This Ordinance shall be so construed as not to conflict with any provision of New Jersey or Federal law.

b. Notwithstanding that any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, all remaining provisions of the Ordinance shall continue to be of full force and effect.

c. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be cumulative with, and not in substitution for, all other applicable zoning, planning and land use regulations.

**SECTION 4.** This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with law and shall be filed with the County Planning Board after adoption.

ORD 2011-19

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, CHAPTER 295 ENTITLED "SUBDIVISION AND SITE PLAN REVIEW" BY ADDING A NEW SUB-SECTION I TO SECTION 295-48 THEREOF**

**WHEREAS**, the governing body wishes to regulate the intensity of use in areas of steeply sloping terrain in order to limit soil loss, erosion, excessive stormwater runoff, the degradation of surface water and to maintain the natural topography and drainage patterns of land.

**WHEREAS**, Disturbance of steep slopes results in accelerated erosion processes from stormwater runoff and the subsequent sedimentation of waterbodies with the associated degradation of water quality and loss of aquatic life support. Related effects include soil loss, changes in natural topography and drainage patterns, increased flooding potential, further fragmentation of forest and habitat areas, and compromised aesthetic values. The governing body recognizes that disturbance of steep slopes should be restricted or prevented based on the impact disturbance of steep slopes can have on water quality and quantity, and the environmental integrity of landscapes.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 295 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled "Subdivision and Site Plan Review" be amended by adding a new sub-section I to Section 295-48 as follows:

## **SECTION 1.**

### **I. Steep slopes**

- A.** This ordinance shall be applicable to new development or land disturbance on a steep slope within the Borough of South River.

**B.** Definitions

"Disturbance" means the placement of impervious surface, the exposure or movement of soil or bedrock, or the clearing, cutting, or removing of vegetation.

"Impervious surface" means any structure, surface, or improvement that reduces or prevents absorption of stormwater into land, and includes porous paving, paver blocks, gravel, crushed stone, decks, patios, elevated structures, and other similar structures, surfaces, or improvements.

"Redevelopment" means the construction of structures or improvements on areas which previously contained structures or other improvements.

"Steep Slopes" means any slope equal to or greater than 20 percent as measured over any minimum run of 10 feet. Steep slopes are determined based on contour intervals of two feet or less.

**C.** Designation of Areas

The percent of slope (rise in feet per horizontal distance) shall be established by measurement of distance perpendicular to the contour of the slope. The percent of slope shall be calculated for each two-foot contour interval. For example, any location on the site where there is a one-foot rise over a 10-foot horizontal run constitutes a 10 percent slope; a 1.5 foot rise over a 10-foot horizontal run constitutes a 15 percent slope; a two-foot rise over a 10-foot horizontal run constitutes a 20 percent slope.

**D.** Steep Slope Limits

For steep slopes any disturbance shall be prohibited except as provided below:

1. Redevelopment within the limits of existing impervious surfaces; and
2. New disturbance necessary to protect public health, safety or welfare, such as necessary linear development with no feasible alternative; to provide an environmental benefit, such as remediation of a contaminated site; to prevent extraordinary hardship on the property owner peculiar to the property; or to prevent extraordinary hardship, provided the hardship was not created by the property owner, that would not permit a minimum economically viable use of the property based upon reasonable investment. For example, redevelopment, within the footprint of existing impervious cover should be allowed to support efforts to revitalize development that has fallen into disrepair.

The applicant shall demonstrate through site plans depicting proposed development and topography that new disturbance is not located in areas with a 20 percent or greater slope.

**E. Enforcement, Violation and Penalties**

A prompt investigation shall be made by the appropriate personnel of the Borough of South River, of any person or entity believed to be in violation hereof. If, upon inspection, a condition which is in violation of this Ordinance is discovered, a civil action in the Special Part of the Superior Court, or in the Superior Court, if the primary relief sought is injunctive or if penalties may exceed the jurisdictional limit of the Special Civil Part, by the filing and serving of appropriate process. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to preclude the right of the Borough of South River, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 26:3A2-25, to initiate legal proceedings hereunder in Municipal Court. The violation of any section or subsection of this Ordinance shall constitute a separate and distinct offense independent of the violation of any other section or subsection, or of any order issued pursuant to this Ordinance. Each day a violation continues shall be considered a separate offense.

Any person or entity who violates any provision of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof, be punished as provided in Chapter 1, Article I, General Penalty.

**SECTION 2.**

All other ordinances, parts of ordinances, or other local requirements that are inconsistent or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby superseded and repealed to the extent of any inconsistency or conflict, and the provisions of this ordinance apply.

**SECTION 3.**

Interpretation: This Ordinance shall be so construed as not to conflict with any provision of New Jersey or Federal law. Notwithstanding that any provision of this Ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, all remaining provisions of the Ordinance shall continue to be of full force and effect. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be cumulative with, and not in substitution for, all other applicable zoning, planning and land use regulations.

**SECTION 4.**

This Ordinance shall take effect upon final adoption and publication in accordance with the law.

BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING IN PART BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2008-19 ADOPTED APRIL 28, 2008, PROVIDING FOR THE PLANNING, SITE ACQUISITION, AND CONSTRUCTION OF MUNICIPAL FACILITIES AND CANCELING THE UNFUNDED DEBT AUTHORIZED IN BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2003-22 ADOPTED ON JULY 21, 2003, AS AMENDED BY BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2006-11 ADOPTED ON MAY 15, 2006, AS AMENDED BY BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2007-13 ADOPTED ON JUNE 11, 2007, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$4,926,000, IN ORDER TO INCREASE THE ALLOCATION OF THE APPROPRIATION TO COSTS PERMITTED UNDER N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough of South River, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Borough") adopted Bond Ordinance No. 2008-19 on April 28, 2008, (the "Prior Ordinance") authorizing the planning, site acquisition, and construction of municipal facilities, and canceling the unfunded debt authorized in Bond Ordinance No. 2003-22 adopted on July 21, 2003, as amended by Bond Ordinance No. 2006-11 adopted on May 15, 2006, as amended by Bond Ordinance No. 2007-13 adopted On June 11, 2007; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the \$500,000 allocation of the \$4,500,000 appropriation authorized by the Prior Ordinance for purposes permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is insufficient and desires to increase such allocation by \$315,000, to an aggregate amount of \$815,000 without increasing the aggregate appropriation or debt authorization for said purposes, by amendment of the Prior Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL of the BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. Section 7(d) of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$815,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

Section Two. The aggregate appropriation of \$4,500,000, the aggregate debt authorization of \$4,275,000, and other authorizations of the Prior Ordinance remain unchanged and are hereby confirmed.

Section Three. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or are inconsistent. In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part hereof other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

Section Four. This amendatory bond ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage, as provided in the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq.
