Dear Township Representative,

I am writing this letter to accompany the permit application for the Cogswell family at 31 Monush Street, South River, NJ 08882, and I am hoping this letter reaches the appropriate person in time.

Recently, we at Trinity Solar were contacted by Mary Doherty from the Paul Jackson Fund, a charity of last resort for families facing a financial crisis due to long-term illness or disability. They told us about a family whose seven year old daughter, Kelly, is in a dire state of health. Kelly has Mitochondrial Disease and has had it for the past six years. Mitochondria are within almost every cell of the body. This is a tragic illness that affects the body's energy and growth systems.

Due to the effects of the Mitochondrial Disease on Kelly's body, she is now restricted to a wheel chair and she depends on a ventilator and nursing care around the clock. If the power goes out, Kelly has a back-up battery, but it will only last two hours. When Kelly's parents came to the Paul Jackson Fund searching for financial help, their only request was for a gas generator so that in the event of a power outage, they would not have to worry about their daughter.

Mary Doherty from The Paul Jackson Fund wrote to us originally in hopes that we would install a generator for the Cogswell family for a discounted price. We agreed that we would help out to the best of our abilities. First, the owners of Trinity Solar have pledged to supply all necessary equipment for the installation as well as using their permitting and design departments to create plans. Next, several employees at Trinity Solar have volunteered to install the generator on their own time at no cost. Finally, the exceptionally generous people at United Supply, our vendor, have agreed to donate a 20kw generator for the family.

I am writing to you to ask if you would be willing to help out too by waiving the permitting fees associated with the generator installation for this family. If we all help out a little bit, it will mean the world to this family and their little girl. Thank you for your time.



Re: Extension of 2% Cap on Interest Arbitration Awards

Dear Mayor:

On December 21, 2010, Governor Christie signed into law reforms to the interest arbitration process. The reforms marked a dramatic change to the arbitration process and have helped municipalities to control the never-ending rise in public safety personnel costs. The reforms, which took effect on January 1, 2011, capped arbitration awards on base salary items to no more than 2% in the aggregate per year of the contract, provided for random selection of arbitrators, expedited the determination of awards, required the arbitrator to provide a written report detailing the weight accorded to each of the required considerations and expedited the appeal process.

The law was a compromise and given the dynamics of the negotiations, the best compromise at the time. Under the terms of the ultimate compromise, the limit on arbitration awards is set to expire in April of this year. Failure to extend the 2.0% cap on interest arbitration awards will force municipalities throughout the State to further reduce or even eliminate crucial services, personnel, and long-overdue infrastructure improvement projects in order to fund an arbitration award.

Absent further action by the Legislature, any contract that expires on or after April 1, 2014, will be subject to all new procedures and requirements, EXCEPT the 2% awards cap. Without those limits, arbitrators will be able to impose awards similar to those issued prior to the implementation of the 2% hard cap. As such, municipalities would still have to comply with the tax levy cap and the appropriations cap without the aid of the 2% hard cap. Such awards would immediately threaten funding for all other municipal services. And, in the not-too-distant future, such awards could force local budget makers to reduce public safety staffing levels, as fewer local employees steadily take home higher percentages of local funds.

Accordingly, a major priority for us will be to convince the Legislature to permanently extend the limitations on arbitration awards, beyond the April 1 'sunset' date. To that end, we request that you adopt the sample resolution, available at [www.njslom.org/resolutions/012114-IA-sample-resolution.pdf](http://www.njslom.org/resolutions/012114-IA-sample-resolution.pdf) as a pdf or at [www.njslom.org/resolutions/012114-IA-sample-resolution.doc](http://www.njslom.org/resolutions/012114-IA-sample-resolution.doc) as word, urging the swift passage of legislation to permanently extend the cap on arbitration awards. We also ask that you reach out to your State Senator and Assembly representatives urging them to take action quickly on this matter.

While the Governor Christie highlighted the 2010 Interest Arbitration Reforms and the need to "renew the cap on interest arbitration and make the cap permanent" in his State of the State address we need the Legislature to act. We have now less than three months for the legislature to act. The clock is ticking. Please contact your Legislators as soon as you can.

**Resolution Calling on the Legislature to Make Permanent the 2% Cap on Interest Arbitration Awards**

**WHEREAS**, on December 21, 2010, Governor Christie signed into law reforms to the Arbitration process that took effect January 1, 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, the reforms capped arbitration awards on economic factors to no more than 2%, provided for random selection of arbitrators, expedited the determination of awards, required the arbitrator to provide a written report detailing the weight accorded to each of the required considerations and expedited the appeal process; and

**WHEREAS**, these reforms marked a dramatic change to the arbitration process and have helped municipalities to control the never-ending rise in public safety personnel costs; and

**WHEREAS**, a key element of the reforms, capping arbitration awards on economic factors to no more than 2% of the property tax levy will expire on April 1, 2014; and

**WHEREAS**, while municipalities are statutorily limited to raise their property tax levy by no more than 2%, with very limited exceptions, failure to extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards will force municipalities throughout the State to further reduce or even eliminate crucial services, personnel, and long-overdue infrastructure improvement projects in order to fund an arbitration award; and

**WHEREAS**, the 2% Interest Arbitration cap has controlled one of the largest municipal expense, public safety salaries, not only through arbitration awards but through contract negotiations; and

**WHEREAS**, absent further action by the Legislature, any contract that expires on or after April 1, 2014, will be subject to all new procedures and requirements, EXCEPT the 2% awards cap; and

**WHEREAS**, without those limits, arbitrators will be able to impose awards that do not account for the 2% limit on the property tax levy, which would immediately threaten funding for all other municipal services; and

**WHEREAS**, without the 2% cap on Interest Arbitration Awards but with the 2% cap on property tax levy local budget makers could be forced to reduce other essential municipal services to fund an arbitration award;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the governing body of the (*insert name of municipality*) strongly urges the Legislature to permanently extend the 2% cap on interest arbitration awards prior to the April 1, 2014 sunset; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that a that a copy of this duly adopted resolution be forwarded to Senate President Stephen Sweeney, Assembly Speaker Vincent Prieto, the legislators of the (*insert municipality's* ) State Legislative representatives, Governor Chris Christie, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.
