Monthly minutes for October 2015 was submitted for approval and/or amendment. Joyce Major made a motion to approve the minutes and was seconded by Beth Lukacs. All members who were on Board and at the October 2015 meeting were in favor.

REPORTS

The monthly registrar reports for October, November, December 2015 were reviewed and read. A motion to accept the reports were made by Beth Lukacs. Seconded by Joyce Major. All members who were on Board for the year 2015 were in favor.

The monthly health inspector's sanitation reports for September, October, November, December 2015 will be placed on February's agenda since the Health Inspector did not attend the meeting.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Food Bank - \$16,161.16 - \$250.00 in gift cards were received from the EB Charitable Foundation for food for the holidays. Food Bank statistics for 2015 were reviewed. Beth thanked the Fire Department for holding a food drive. Beth reviewed the guidelines and the bus transportation for the new members. She also told them about the diaper program and the Community Food Bank of NJ. She gave an update regarding the Website and also there is an answering machine at the food bank which is working out well. She stated that the Thanksgiving Dinner went great and thanked everyone who came out to help. One recommendation that everyone agrees with is to get the word out to all the residents of South River that there is a Food Bank in town.

2. Animal Control – \$193.88 – Larisa gave an update about the Low-Cost Spay/Neutering for Dogs and Cats. September: 3 cats 2 dogs, October: 2 cats and 2 dogs, November: none, December: 3 cats and 1 dog. She stated that the Neuter Scooter is now called the People for Animals Spay Shuttle. We have the new dates for January, February and April. The Website and TV-35 will be updated. Copies will also be available the 48 Washington Street. Larisa also updated the cat colonies. There are 7 colonies that still exist in the Borough with 21 cats in total. There are 7 cats that have been taken in and are no longer on property, none outdoors. There are 10 locations where either no one responded to the message Larisa left or the phone number is no longer in service or there was no phone to begin with. Larisa will give us an update periodically.
3. Event Planning - \$1,096.61 – Allison and Beth stated that the coat drive went well. Beth will be getting out thank you notes to the agencies that helped get this organized. She will also be getting out thank you notes to the agencies who helped put the Thanksgiving Dinner together.
4. Operation RAM - \$1,199.89 – Still looking for names.
5. Frost on the Pumpkin - \$8,361.29 – Too early for planning. Date is 10/30/2016.
6. Relay for Life – Date is Saturday, May 16, 2016. Many of the members this year cannot make the Relay for Life but will look into joining another team. Maybe the possibility of having a Borough of SR Team which can include all employees, volunteers, boards and commissions, mayor and council.

NEW BUSINESS

Allison stated that the Board of Health is a great group and we all work for Town and should be proud and continue this throughout the year and years to come. She wanted to address the homeless situation in Town and how can the Board help in this. It was recommended by Beth to place it on the next agenda when Mark Tinitigan is present, since he may have better knowledge with this.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Ryan Jones stated that 10/16 to 10/23 is National Food Bank Week. He stated that he will also be looking into ways on how to promote the SR Food Bank. He will also try to take information to Assemblywoman Pinken to help get the word out.

There was a student from the College of St. Elizabeth attending the meeting. She is taking public health classes and had to attend a meeting to observe and write a paper on for one of her classes.

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


