ORD 2009-36

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, CHAPTER 124 ENTITLED “CIRCUSES AND CARNIVALS” BY AMENDING SECTION 124-4B” THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 124 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled “Circuses and Carnivals” be amended by amending Section 124-4B, as follows:

SECTION 1.

124-4. Requirements.

B. The applicant shall furnish to the Borough a good and sufficient bond in the sum of [\$10,000] \$2,500, on condition that they will leave the streets of the Borough in as good a condition as they find them and that they will immediately clean up and remove any litter, trash and rubbish from the grounds used and streets adjacent thereto.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, CHAPTER 255 ENTITLED "PEDDLING AND SOLICITING" BY AMENDING SECTION 255-3A(9)" THEREOF

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 255 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled "Peddling and Soliciting" be amended by amending Section 255-3A(9), as follows:

SECTION 1.

255-3A. Application for Permit and License.

(9) A statement by a reputable physician [of the Borough of South River] licensed by the State of New Jersey, dated not more than 10 days prior to the submission of the application, certifying the applicant to be free of contagious, infectious or communicable disease.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause of provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

ORD 2009-38

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, CHAPTER 108 ENTITLED "ANIMALS" BY AMENDING SECTIONS 108-41, 43, 44, 46 AND ADDING NEW SECTIONS 49 AND 50 TO ARTICLE VII "FERAL CATS" THEREOF

WHEREAS, the governing body desires to amend Chapter 108 entitled “Animals”.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of South River, that Chapter 108 of the Code of the Borough of South River entitled “Animals” be amended by amending sections 108-41, 43, 44, and 46 and adding new sections 108-49 and 50 as follows:

SECTION 1.

ARTICLE VII
Feral Cats

108-41. Definitions.

For the purpose of this article, the following terms shall have the meaning set forth in this section. When not inconsistent with the context, words used in the present tense include the future, words in the plural number include the singular, words in the singular number include the plural, and words in the male gender include the female gender.

ABANDONED — An owner or caregiver has forsaken a domesticated cat entirely, or has neglected or refused to provide care and support of the cat.

ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER — Any person employed or appointed by the Borough who is authorized to investigate violations of laws and regulations concerning animals, and to issue citations in accordance with New Jersey law and this Code.

CAREGIVER — Any person who provides food, water or shelter to or otherwise cares for a cat; a volunteer, uncompensated person who agrees to serve to facilitate the TNR program within the Borough in accordance with this article and any rules and regulations that may be established by the Board of Health. A caregiver shall not be deemed an employee of the Borough and shall hold such volunteer position at the pleasure of the Board of Health and may be removed from or precluded from holding such volunteer position in the sole discretion of the Board of Health.

DOMESTICATED CAT — A cat that is socialized to humans and is appropriate as a companion for humans.

EARTIPPING — Straight-line cutting of the tip of the left ear of a cat while the cat is anesthetized; the marking of a cat's ear through a surgical procedure performed by qualified personnel.

FERAL CAT — A cat that exists in a wild or untamed state, either due to birth or reversion to a wild state from domestication. The usual and consistent temperament of a feral cat is extreme fear and resistance to contact with humans. Feral cats are completely or substantially unsocialized to humans.

FERAL CAT COLONY — A group of cats that congregates, more or less, together as a unit. Although not every cat in a colony may be feral, any nonferal cats that congregate with a colony shall be deemed to be a part of it.

FERAL CAT COMMITTEE (FCC) – A committee appointed by the Board of Health to serve as a sponsor of a Trap-Neuter-Return program.

NUISANCE — Disturbing the peace by:

- A. Habitually or continually howling, crying or screaming; or
- B. The habitual and significant destruction, desecration or soiling of property against the wishes of the owner of the property.

OWNER — Any person, firm, corporation, partnership, association, trust, estate, or any other legal entity.

RESCUE GROUP — A for-profit or not-for-profit entity, or a collaboration of individuals with at least one of its purposes being the adoption or placement of cats in homes with humans to serve as companion animals.

STRAY CAT — A cat that is regularly off the property of the owner, is not under the physical control and restraint of the owner and is not regularly provided with food by its owner.

SUITABLE SHELTER — Shelter that provides protection from rain, sun, and other elements that is adequate to protect the health of the cat.

TNR — Trap, neuter, and return.

TNR PROGRAM — A program pursuant to which feral and stray cats are trapped, neutered or spayed, vaccinated against rabies and returned to the location where they congregate.

ZOONOTIC DISEASE — Those diseases transmittable to humans from animals, including parasitic, bacterial, fungal and viral diseases.

108-42 Responsibilities of owners of domesticated cats.

- A. Owners of domesticated cats shall provide appropriate and adequate food, water and shelter for their cats.
- B. The owner of a domesticated cat shall exercise reasonable care to guard against the cat creating a nuisance.
- C. The owner of a sexually intact (not spayed or neutered) domesticated cat shall not permit his/her cat to roam unsupervised.
- D. An owner shall not under any circumstances abandon a domesticated cat. §

108-43. Feral cat colonies.

A. Feral cat colonies shall be permitted and caregivers shall be entitled to maintain them in accordance with the terms and conditions of this article. The Board of Health may appoint a committee (Feral Cat Committee) of residents and other interested parties to specifically sponsor feral cat colonies and implement the provisions of this Article.

B. The Board of Health or Feral Cat Committee (FCC) requirements. It shall be the duty of the Board of Health or Feral Cat Committee to:

(1) Review and approve of colony caregivers;

(2) Help to resolve any complaints over the conduct of a colony caregiver or of cats within a colony;

(3) Maintain records provided by colony caregivers on the size and location of the colonies as well as the vaccination and spay/neuter records of cats in the sponsor's colonies; and

(4) Report annually to the Borough of South River on the following:

(a) Number of colonies in the Borough;

(b) Total number of cats in colonies;

(c) Number of cats and kittens spayed and neutered pursuant to the TNR program;
and

(d) Number of cats and kittens placed in permanent homes.

(5) Use due consideration to avoid the taking of rare, threatened or endangered species under the Endangered and Non Game Species Conservation Act, N.J.S.A. 23:2A-1, et seq.

C. Each feral cat colony will be registered by the caregivers with either the Board of Health or Feral Cat Committee if one has been formed, which will serve as a clearinghouse for information on current caregivers, education for new caregivers, and assistance for persons found in violation of this article.

D. The Board of Health may establish a fund to provide services to offset the costs of trapping, neutering, and vaccinating captured feral cats that can be returned to an appropriate, controlled, protected, and registered colony site. Caregivers for such colonies, whether one or several animals, may be aided by the Board of Health in providing traps for the capture of the cat, transportation to a spay/neuter facility and offsetting costs, to the extent that funding is available.

E. The Board of Health may also provide funds to support educational programs related to feral cat populations.

F. The Board of Health and/or Feral Cat Committee may apply for grants as available to support TNR programs. § 108-44. Federal cat caregiver requirements.

108-44 Feral cat caregiver requirements.

A. Caregivers are responsible for the following:

(1) Registering the feral cat colony with the Board of Health (BOH) or Feral Cat Committee.

(2) Taking steps that are reasonably likely to result in the vaccination of the colony population for [the] rabies (three-year vaccine) and any other infectious disease as mandated by law and making reasonable efforts to update the vaccination on cats that can be recaptured.

(3) Taking steps that are reasonably likely to result in the spay/neuter, by a licensed veterinarian, of at least 90% of the colony population.

(4) Providing the Board of Health (BOH) or Feral Cat Committee with a description of each cat in the colony and copies of documents evidencing that the cats have been vaccinated and spayed/neutered.

(5) Providing food, water and, if feasible, shelter for colony cats through the year.

(6) Observing the colony cats at least twice per week and keeping a record of any illnesses or unusual behavior noticed in any colony cats.

(7) Obtaining the approval of the owner of any property to which the caregiver requires access to provide colony care.

(8) In the event that kittens are born to a colony cat, the caregiver shall take reasonable steps likely to result in the removal of the kittens from the colony after they have been weaned, and the placement of the kittens in homes or foster homes for the purpose of subsequent permanent placement.

(9) Reporting annually in writing to the Board of Health (BOH) or Feral Cat Committee on the status of the colony, including data on the number and gender of all cats in the colony; the number of cats that died or otherwise ceased being a part of the colony during the year; the number of kittens born to colony cats and their disposition; and the number of cats and kittens placed in permanent homes as companion cats; and

(10) Obtaining proper medical attention to any colony cat that appears to require it; make every attempt to "ear tip" all cats with a single cut preferably on the left ear for

each cat in the colony. If this is not practicable under the circumstances, photographic documentation adequate to identify the cat shall be obtained.

B. If, for any reason, a caregiver can no longer perform the duties as stated in this section, it shall be the responsibility of that individual to find a replacement caregiver for the colony in question, who will then manage the colony in compliance with this section.

108-45. Colony cat requirements.

A. The left ear of a colony cat that has been spayed or neutered and vaccinated shall be eartipped.

108-46. Disposition of colony cats.

A. An Animal Control Officer who has trapped a cat whose left ear has been tipped or which bears some other distinguished mark indicating that it belongs to a feral cat colony shall notify the Board of Health or Feral Cat Committee, as the case may be.

B. If the caregiver is not able to immediately take custody of the cat, the officer shall transport the cat to the Sayrebrook Veterinary Hospital Animal Shelter. The caregiver shall be responsible for retrieving the cat from the shelter within three business days or advising the shelter if the caregiver does not intend to retrieve the cat.

108-47. Enforcement.

The Borough shall have the following rights:

A. The right to seize or remove cats from a colony that have not been vaccinated against rabies and which are demonstrating signs of the disease.

B. The right to seize/remove a cat from a colony that is creating a nuisance as defined above after the caregiver has been given 60 days to remove and relocate the cat and has failed to do so.

C. The right to seize/remove a colony of cats when the caregiver regularly fails to comply with the requirements of § 108-44.

108-48. Additional [Other] rights.

Borough [the]health officers and police officers may investigate any nuisance complaint despite the requirements of this article.

108-49. Other provisions.

A. Managed feral colonies registered with the Board of Health or Feral Cat Committee shall be exempt from licensing.

B. It shall be unlawful to feed feral cats unless they are spayed/neutered and vaccinated in accordance with this Article. Animal Control Officers shall be empowered to give warning notices to individuals feeding feral cats outside the guidelines of this Article requiring them to contact the Board of Health or Feral Cat Committee, within 30 days, to obtain help getting the cats neutered and vaccinated and otherwise brought into compliance with this Article. Failure to make such contact within 30 days and cooperate with the committee may result in fines of up to \$100 per cat.

C. It shall be unlawful for any person to actually abuse, threaten to abuse or interfere in any way with the management or operation of any registered feral cat colony.

108-50. Violations and penalties.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this article shall, upon conviction, be punished as provided in Chapter 1, Article 1, General Penalty, and each violation of any of the provisions of this Article and each day the same is violated shall be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct offense.

SECTION 2. If any section, paragraph, subdivision, clause of provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subdivision, clause, or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION 3. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with or in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect after final passage, adoption, and publication according to law.

Mayor Eppinger opened the hearing to the public for comments/questions.

Prof. Marie Sewerski, 14 Schack Ave.

- Presented a petition from residents opposing the use of borough funds for the formation of a feral cat committee; law requires that feral colonies provide Borough Council with copies of reports; feels report she received was inadequate; asked for more detailed reporting; asked Borough Council to consider postponing adoption of this ordinance. Mayor Eppinger stated that there is nothing in ordinance stating money is coming from taxpayers. The ordinance has been in effect since 2006. The amendment allows a committee to be set up in order to deal with the feral cat problem. A trust fund will be set up. It is not the intention of the Borough to fund this program through taxpayer funds.
- Reiterated request to table ordinance amendment until all concerns are addressed. Borough Council will re-enforce cat colonies with adoption of this amendment. Mayor Eppinger stated that the amendment gives us a way to get the ordinance to work by using the TNR program. Councilman Almeida stated there is a serious feral cat problem in town – over

1,000 cats. The amendment provides for an entity to enforce feral cat colonies. Councilman Razzano asked if the people who signed the petition are against the feral cat ordinance. Ms. Sewerski stated yes. Councilman Razzano stated that the amendment has little to do with the ordinance. If Council voted no, it would not be supporting TNR. He suggested group come to the Council with a valid reason to repeal the ordinance. Councilman Trenga stated there is a serious feral cat problem. The ordinance amendment is trying to solve this problem. South River is one of 125 TNR towns in the state.

Dr. Teresa Hutchison, 3 Washington St.

- Board of Health member; purpose of ordinance amendment is to help solve problem; wants to allay fears of citizens; would not burden taxpayers; looking for support.

Michele Learner

- Attorney for Project TNR; Board of Health contacted her on this issue; TNR works in other communities; recommended forming committee

Mary Mecca, 42 Dailey St.

- Believes in TNR program; will use her funds; have to get the feral cat problem under control; people have to be more positive

Joe Manzo, Willett Ave..

- 1,000 feral cats are trapped, neutered, vaccinated – how does that get rid of the cats? Councilman Almeida stated the cats would not multiply.

Larisa Culvert

- There are many cats that are strays and are adoptable.

Susan Blum Nuzzo, 31 East St.

- Is a manager of a feral cat colony; cats are taken care of and are spayed and neutered.

Paul Zelanko, Chairman, Board of Health

- Not an expert on feral cats, but an expert on the problem in South River.
- Tabling amendment would be a bad idea; formation of a committee will help solve the problem; amendment has teeth in it to stop people from feeding stray cats; it will stop people from abusing colonies. Councilman Razzano asked how you can tell a stray cat from a feral cat. Mr. Zelanko stated that stray cats will allow you to pet them, feral cats do not show themselves.

Sean Hauserman

- Asked what the amendment does. Mayor Eppinger stated that a committee will be formed to address the feral cat problem.

- Board of Health would be better forum to discuss concerns of both sides, passing ordinance would be in the best interest of the borough. Mr. Schwartz stated the ordinance amendment allows the Board of Health to form a committee.

No further comments were made. Councilman Razzano moved that the public hearing be closed. Councilman Guindi seconded the motion. So carried.

Mayor Eppinger asked the Councilmembers as to the action to be taken on this Ordinance. Councilman Trzeciak moved that the ordinance be approved and the Clerk be authorized to publish same as is required by law. Councilman Almeida seconded the motion.

Mayor Eppinger asked if the Councilmembers have any comments.

Council Comments

- Councilman Razzano stated he will vote for the amendment. He told residents who are against the ordinance, he would meet with them and if valid points are raised as to why the ordinance should be repealed, he will make a motion to repeal it. For now, he is in favor of TNR.
- Councilman Almeida stated he believes amendment provides a pro-active approach to a serious problem. Formation of a committee will address the issue.
- Councilman Trenga agreed with Councilman Almeida.
- Mayor Eppinger stated that the feral cat problem has been going on for a number of years. The amendment is a way to try and solve the problem. He suggested residents who are opposed to this issue to attend Board of Health meetings to raise their concerns.

Hearing no further comments, Mayor Eppinger asked the Clerk to call the roll.

BOND ORD 2009-39

BOND ORDINANCE AMENDING IN PART BOND ORDINANCE NO. 2008-50 ADOPTED ON DECEMBER 23, 2008, PROVIDING FOR THE ACQUISITION OF VARIOUS EQUIPMENT, ROAD IMPROVEMENTS AND VARIOUS OTHER IMPROVEMENTS, IN ORDER TO EXPAND THE SCOPE OF IMPROVEMENTS TO INCLUDE THE MILLING AND OVERLAY OF ROOSEVELT STREET, AND TO INCREASE THE ALLOCATION OF THE APPROPRIATION TO COSTS PERMITTED UNDER N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20, AUTHORIZED IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the Borough of South River, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Borough") finally adopted Bond Ordinance No. 2008-50 on December 23, 2008 (the "Prior

Ordinance”), providing for the Acquisition of Various Equipment, Road Improvements and Various other Improvements, by and in the Borough of South River; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the project description set forth in the Prior Ordinance needs to be amended, without increasing the aggregate appropriation or debt authorization for said purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has determined that the \$100,000 allocation of the \$1,180,000 appropriation authorized by the Prior Ordinance for purposes permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is insufficient and desires to increase such allocation by \$15,000, to an aggregate amount of \$115,000, without increasing the aggregate appropriation or debt authorization for said purposes, by amendment of the Prior Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the BOROUGH COUNCIL of the BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section One. Section 3(a)(vii) and (viii) of the Prior Ordinance, are hereby amended to read as follows:

vii) The Annual Road Milling and Paving Program, including the milling and overlay of Roosevelt Street, with a total appropriation and estimated cost of \$170,000, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes therefor of \$161,500, and an average period of usefulness of 5 years;

viii) North End Drive improvements and the milling and overlay of Roosevelt Street, with a total appropriation and estimated cost of \$430,000, including \$250,000 grant funds expected to be received from the New Jersey Department of Transportation, estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes therefor of \$171,000, and an average period of usefulness of 20 years;

Section Two. Section 5(d) of the Prior Ordinance is hereby amended to read as follows:

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$115,000 for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs, legal fees and other items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included as part of the cost of said improvements and is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for said improvements.

Section Three. The aggregate appropriation of \$1,180,000, and the aggregate debt authorization of \$883,500, and other authorizations set forth in the Prior Ordinance remain unchanged and are hereby confirmed.

Section Four. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent that they are in such conflict or are inconsistent. In the event that any section, part or provision of this ordinance shall be held to be

unconstitutional or invalid by any court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part hereof other than the part so held unconstitutional or invalid.

Section Five. This amendatory bond ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage, as provided in the Local Bond Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-1 et seq.

ORD 2009-40

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING VARIOUS FEDERAL HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT GRANT IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT LOCATED IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH RIVER IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY
